Logo


In 2003 we commissioned an artist to create imagery to represent and celebrate AAPI women. Our "dancing woman," as she's affectionately come to be known, symbolizes AAPI women in motion as well as lifting up our diverse lineage. The movement you see is commonly found in Asian traditional folk dances and demonstrates our build to wholeness.

The default color choice when using the logo should be black and red.

For readability on lighter or darker backgrounds, please use a white or black version of the logo.

For branding on social media, you can also use the logo fully red.

To keep our logo consistent, only use the color combinations listed here.







Logos

Logo: Responsive Versions

These are alternate versions of our logo that should be used in situations where the full logo cannot be displayed.

Full

Smallest: 105 x 75 pixels Largest: 260 x 185 pixels

The full logo is the default version to use on formal documents and graphics.

Mini

Smallest: 170 x 120 pixels Largest: 210 x 140 pixels

The mini logo should be used if the full name would be to small to read. It is acceptable to use this logo on social media graphics posted to NAPAWF's accounts.

lcon

The Dancing Woman should only be used alone in situations where there is no space for the rest of the logo. This should be approved on a case-by-case basis by the communications team.

Flat

A flat version of the logo designed for use on our website, or in other situations where there is not enough vertical clearance for our full logo. Use only approved on a case-by-case basis by the communications team.





Logos

Chapter Logo Versions

Logos for our chapters have the chapter name listed underneath the wordmark and full name.

Chapter logos are distinct from our main logo (referred to as the "national logo"). A chapter logo and the national logo can appear together on the same graphic.

Translated Logo Versions


Translated logos replace our full name (and any chapter name) with an in-language version of our full name. The NAPAWF acronym remains the same for recognizability.

The same logo should not appear multiple times in different languages; for example, an English and a Hindi version of the national logo should not be placed on the same document. To list our name in multiple languages, use our mini logo on its own, or with a list of all languages, as demonstrated below.


Logos

Logo Rules

No elements should be placed inside the bounding box (rectangular space) of the logo, except for chapter names or the website & social spread.

It is recommended that the logo be given space on each side equal to the height of the acronym letters in the logo.

The "napawf" is placed in a specific position next to the dancing woman. The wordmark abbreviation is based on the size of the torso. Do not adjust where the "napawf" is positioned next to the dancing woman.



Typography

The main body typeface for NAPAWF is **Fira Sans.** This typeface should be used for paragraphs. Bold Fira Sans fonts can be used as a substitute for headers when Founders Grotesk is not available. Download Fira Sans for free from Google Fonts at **fonts.google.com/specimen/Fira+Sans**

Research Overview

Economic Justice

Too often, mainstream conversations about economic injustice misrepresent AAPI communities. The dangerous 'model minority' myth stereotypes and falsely characterizes Asian Americans as having achieved economic stability and security while pitting communities of color against each other.

We are facing an abortion access crisis.

Typography

Vietnamese Text

Vietnamese uses Latin letters with diacritics, marks added above and below the letters, to mark the tone of a vowel. There is also an additional letter, D with Stroke (Φ/d) .

Not all fonts support all Vietnamese letters. Of NAPAWF's brand fonts:

Fira Sans does support Vietnamese; Founders Grotesk does not.

Please use Fira Sans for all Vietnamese text.

Non-Latin Scripts

When working with non-Latin scripts, our first priority is ensuring the text is readable and presented properly. Branding comes second. You will likely need to use a different font for languages that use non-Latin scripts.

Fira Sans has a Global Language Extension, FiraGO, that supports writing in Arabic, Thai, and Devanagari (script used for Hindi and other South Asian languages). This typeface is available for free at **bboxtype.com/typefaces/FiraGO**

NAPAWF is pronounced "NAP-off". IPA: (næp - of).


Our website is **www.napawf.org**. The "www" is not required, but we suggest including it if you have the space.
